

# FluMist® (Influenza Virus Vaccine Live, Intranasal) Screening Form

The following questions will help us determine if a patient is eligible for FluMist today.

Children as young as 2 years of age and adults through 49 years of age may qualify.

**YES NO** 1. Do any of the following apply to the person to be vaccinated with FluMist?

*(If your answer is YES, the person to be vaccinated cannot receive FluMist.)*

- Allergy to eggs or egg proteins, gentamicin, gelatin, or arginine
- Life-threatening reactions to influenza vaccine in the past
- Is between 2-17 years of age and currently receiving aspirin or aspirin-containing therapy

**YES NO** 2. Does the person to be vaccinated expect to have close contact within the next 7 days with

**a person whose immune system is so severely compromised (to the degree that he/she must be in a protective environment, such as a negative pressure hospital room)?<sup>1</sup>**

*(If your answer is YES, the person to be vaccinated cannot receive FluMist.)*

**YES NO** 3. Do any of the following apply to the person being vaccinated?

*(If your answer is YES, please discuss with a healthcare professional whether the person to be vaccinated can receive FluMist.)*

- Asthma
- Is under 5 years of age and has recurrent wheezing (since this may be asthma equivalent in this age group)
- Experienced Guillain-Barré syndrome within 6 weeks after any prior influenza vaccination
- Long-term health problem with weakened immune system or heart, lung, liver, kidney, or metabolic disease (e.g., diabetes), anemia or other blood disorders
- Is pregnant or nursing

**FluMist may not protect all individuals receiving the vaccine.**

**Most common side effects were generally mild and included runny nose or nasal congestion, fever, and sore throat.<sup>2</sup>**

## Important Safety Information

### Who may be eligible for FluMist® (Influenza Virus Vaccine Live, Intranasal)?

FluMist is a live weakened influenza virus vaccine approved for the prevention of certain types of influenza disease in children, adolescents and adults 2-49 years of age. FluMist may not protect everyone who gets it. FluMist is for intranasal administration only.

### Who may not be able to get FluMist?

FluMist is not right for everyone. FluMist must not be given to people with history of hypersensitivity to eggs, egg proteins, gentamicin, gelatin or arginine; people with life-threatening reactions to previous influenza vaccinations; and children and adolescents receiving aspirin or aspirin-containing therapy.

Children under 24 months of age are not eligible for FluMist.

The following people may not be able to get FluMist or may be able to get it only in certain situations: people with asthma or active wheezing, or children less than 5 years of age with recurrent wheezing; people with a history of Guillain-Barré syndrome; people with a weakened immune system; people with long-term medical conditions including heart disease, kidney disease, and metabolic diseases, such as diabetes; and pregnant women.

If your child falls into one of these groups, **be sure to tell your healthcare provider.** They will decide if FluMist is right for your child.

### What are the most common side effects of FluMist?

Most common side effects were generally mild and included runny nose or nasal congestion, sore throat, and fever. For a full list of side effects, please see section 6.1 in the enclosed product information.
